



Set in the beautiful countryside, Beaufort Park Hotel is an independently run 3* hotel situated 5 minutes' drive from the historic market town of Mold. It offers 105 guest rooms and is designed to a very high standard with tasteful furnishings. Each room features an en-suite bathroom with toiletries, a hairdryer, TV, ironing facilities and tea/coffee making facilities. Arches Bar and Coffee House provides an informal, relaxed atmosphere serving carefully selected beers, locally sourced guest ales,

wines and spirits with a full array of soft drinks. The Orchard Restaurant is for more formal dining with the finest cuisine in a relaxed atmosphere. They have a 5* hygiene rating.

HOLIDAY CENTRE

Mold is a town in Flintshire, Wales, on the River Alyn. Set on the North Welsh coast, offering a great variety of scenery with its spacious beaches and rugged cliffs, little fishing villages and secluded bays. It is the largest historic market town in this county. The town has developed around Mold Castle, an earthwork motte and bailey fortress, probably founded by Robert de Montalt around the year 1140.

Day 1. Depart Local Area

The hotel has been a favourite of ours since we first visited in the year 2000. This very private hotel has been family-run for years and has a very relaxing and comfortable air about it. Beautiful quiet lounges for relaxing, superb Tom Noggi Restaurant with excellent cuisine, well-equipped comfortable bedrooms with bath or shower, which are all shapes and sizes, giving the hotel its character, all set in its own grounds in the centre of St Agnes. The village is set back from the cliffs by ¾ mile; Trevaunance Cove is the

nearest thing to a sheltered harbour that this inhospitable coast affords. Strewn with old mine workings, copper and tin ore were once shipped from the cove.

HOLIDAY CENTRE

Tucked into a stunning and unspoilt spot on the coast, St. Agnes sits in both a designated Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and a World Heritage Site. St Agnes is a picturesque village on the north coast of Cornwall. Steeped in mining history, the village retains a traditional, friendly Cornish atmosphere and makes a wonderful base for a holiday, with four different beaches. There are dramatic coastal walks and breathtaking scenery filled with relics from the past, including the iconic Wheal Coates engine house. You will discover a thriving community with a choice of shops as well as galleries and craft workshops where beautiful gifts are made by hand. Sample the beautiful scenic coastline, fantastic beaches, arts and craft shops and mining heritage.

Day 1. Depart Local Area

After boarding your luxury coach, your holiday has now started. You start your journey by travelling westward with stops en-route for lunch. Day 2. Eden Project

Day 3. St Austell & Brewery

After breakfast, we travel across Cornwall to the town of St Austell. St Austell, being one of Cornwall's



biggest towns, means they have a lot to offer. It is also home to the famous St Austell Brewery, founded in 1851. Here we will have a guided tour of the brewery with its history, and at the end of the tour, a beer tasting. We then go into town for free time. Cornwall's China clay industry also lies in the heart of St Austell. The rich history of China clay mining can be discovered at Cornwall's only China clay works, based in St Austell at Wheal Martyn Museum Later returning to the hotel

Day 4. Bodmin Jail & Truro

This morning, you will take a trip to Bodmin Jail, which seems to be a favourite of everyone. As with most old prisons, Bodmin Jail has a dark history. 55 executions took place within its formidable walls for crimes such as rape, murder and theft. Eight of these were women. You can immerse yourself in Cornwall's dark history in the new 'Dark Walk' with state-of-the-art theatrical effects that bring some of the grimmest stories vividly to life. There is also a cafe and shop on site. From Bodmin Jail, you then travel to Truro, time for that last-minute shopping or to explore

Day 4. New Forest & Lyndhurst

The New Forest is a former royal hunting area in the south of England. It was created in 1079 by William I (known as William the Conqueror) as a

hunting area, principally of deer. It is a unique area of historical, ecological and agricultural significance, and retains many of the rural practices conceded by the Crown in historical times to local people. Principal of these is the pasturing of ponies, cattle, pigs and donkeys in the open Forest by local inhabitants known as commoners. The New Forest has also been an important source of timber for the Crown. Lyndhurst is often thought of as the Capital of the New Forest it enjoys a broadly central location, is surrounded by relatively fertile land, and stands at a junction of historic routes. There's no better starting point for visitors than the centrally located New Forest Museum, which gives a unique guide into the forest's history and heritage. Towering over the skyline is the church of St Michael and All Angels where the grave of former Lyndhurst resident Alice Liddell, Lewis Carroll's inspiration for Alice in Wonderland, can be found. Lyndhurst offers a wide range of shops, cosy tea rooms, old world pubs, cafes and fine restaurants to discover.

Day 5. Depart for Home

After breakfast and the cases have been loaded onto the coach, we say farewell to our hosts at the Suncliff Hotel and head for home. On departing hotel, we head for Shaftesbury. Steeped in history and tradition, it offers visitors breathtaking views and the warmest of welcomes. Shaftesbury is a small market town with history that goes back to medieval times and hill-top forts The "Shaston" of Thomas Hardy's novels, Shaftesbury is one of the oldest and highest towns in England and dominates what Hardy called the "engirdled and secluded" Blackmore Vale. The beauty of the surrounding Dorset countryside is complemented by the collection of fine historical buildings that make up the centre of Shaftesbury itself. Gold Hill made famous by the Hovis Bread advertisement, with its steep cobbles and picturesque cottages is the epitome of rural charm from a previous time. On departing from Shaftesbury, we

continue our journey home, arriving in your local area by early evening.

The 3* superior hotel is located directly on the historic market square in Schlüsselfeld and offers modern comfort in a family atmosphere. The rooms are spread over two separate buildings, which are only 100 meters apart. All are modern rooms with en-suite, hairdryer, TV, radio and free Wi-Fi. There is a breakfast buffet with regional specialities. The restaurant serves Franconian cuisine and seasonal dishes.

HOLIDAY CENTRE

Schlüsselfeld is in the southern part of the Bamberg district of Germany and is surrounded by picturesque hills. The town has a rich history with numerous historical buildings, such as the town parish church of St. Johannes Baptist or Thurnau Castle from the 18th century. The Franconian Open-Air Museum Fladungen with its faithfully reproduced half-timbered houses, and the Banz Monastery from the 11th century. Even in rainy weather, there is plenty to discover in Schlüsselfeld: Visit the museum of medieval town history or enjoy a cup of coffee in one of the cosy cafés. Schlüsselfeld is worth a visit at any time of year.

Day 1. Depart Dover

After boarding your coach, you make your way to Dover for our morning DFDS ferry crossing. There is a meal voucher included for food and a drink. We travel through France and Belgium with comfort stops, to Liege and our overnight hotel, with dinner, bed and breakfast.

Day 2. Depart for Germany

After breakfast, we make our way from Belgium into Germany and on to our hotel in Schlüsselfeld, Bavaria. There will be stops en-route for food and drink. On arrival, there will be porterage. At dinner, there will be a welcome drink, and tea/coffee after a Franconian-themed meal.

Day 3. Wurzburg

After breakfast, we set off through the Franconian vineyards for a full day in the beautiful city of Wurzburg, with a 60-minute guided walking tour of the old city, with an English-speaking guide. It is known for lavish baroque and rococo architecture. Later we will

experience Juliusspital Winery, with a 60-minute guided tour of the winery, which also includes a glass of wine. Later, we return to the hotel to relax before dinner, followed by a wine tasting of five different wines.

Day 4. Nuremberg

Today, after breakfast, we set off for Nuremberg, the largest city in Bavaria, with a surrounding wall and 80 towers. The Nazis chose Nuremberg as the venue for their annual rallies including the most notoriously successful rally of 1926. Here we will have a 90-minute guided walking tour of the city with an English-speaking guide. There will also be a guided tour of Franconian Brewery, including 2 glasses of beer. We return to the hotel to relax before dinner.

Day 5. Rothenburg

After breakfast, we head for the beautiful old Franconian imperial city of Rothenburg ob der Tauber, and one of the oldest towns to be crossed by the Romantic Road. It is surrounded

by walls and towers, almost untouched since the 30-year war (1631). Here we shall have a fascinating guided walking tour to see its medieval architecture, preserved gate houses and the Gothicstyle St Jacob's Church. You will have free time before we return to the hotel, where there will be entertainment after dinner.

Day 6. Depart for Liège

After an early breakfast and cases have been loaded on the coach, we say farewell to our hotel, and we will be retracing our steps to our overnight hotel at Liège with dinner and breakfast. There will be comfort stops on the way.

Day 7. Depart for Home

After breakfast and overnight bags have been loaded, we say farewell to our hosts at the hotel and make our way back to the Dunkirk ferry port for our afternoon ferry. There will be a meal voucher included for food and a drink. We should arrive back in our local area mid-evening.



The Victorians added the Covered Market, in Market Street, Orchard Street, and Miller Arcade. The picturesque Georgian town was then transformed by the Industrial Revolution, bringing mills, engineering works, housing, canals, and railways. The River Ribble enabled Preston to become a trading port from the mid-14th century, with that growth leading to its development of an 18th-century quay and large inland dock in the 19th century. In 1777 the first cotton-spinning mill was built. By 1835 there were 40 factories, mainly spinning, producing 70,000 pounds (32,000 kg) of cotton yarn weekly. Cotton was the principal employer for more than 150 years, and famous names such as Horrockses took their cotton cloth all around the world. Preston is also where the inventors Richard Arkwright and John Kay developed the water frame textile spinning machine.

Day 1. Depart Local Area

Costumed demonstrators around the museum will make the visit even more enjoyable, explaining the displays or demonstrating traditional crafts and

Chatham is one of the Medway towns located within the Medway. The town developed around Chatham Dockyard and several army barracks, together with 19th-century forts which provided a defensive shield for the dockyard. The engineers are still based in Chatham at Brompton Barracks. Chatham stands on the A2 road along the line of the ancient Celtic route, which was paved by the Romans, and named Watling Street by the Anglo-Saxons. Among finds have been the remains of a Roman cemetery. It long remained a small village on the banks of the river, but by the 16th century warships were being moored at Gillingham water (Gillingham), because of its strategic sheltered location between London and the continent. It was established as a royal dockyard by Queen Elizabeth I in 1568 and most of the dockyard actually lies within Gillingham. It became a shipbuilding yard; from then until the late 19th century, further expansion of the yard took place. In its time, many thousands of men were employed at the dockyard, and many hundreds of vessels were launched there, including HMS Victory which was built there in the 1760's. After World War I many submarines were also built in Chatham Dockyard.

Day 1. Depart Local Area

Hever Castle still has one of Henry VIII's private locks, taken with him on his various visits to noblemen's houses and fitted to every door for his security. After your historic visit, we will head back to our hotel for an evening dinner.

Day 3. Leeds Castle & Kent & East Sussex Railway

This morning, you will visit Leeds Castle; it has been called the "loveliest castle in the world". Listed in the Domesday Book, this castle has been a Norman stronghold, a royal residence and a royal palace. Its situation is stunning, set on two islands in a magnificent lake. The Royal Manor was originally built in 857 AD and owned by a Saxon royal family. After the Norman Conquest, work began on building the first stone castle on the site. You will have time to see the castle and grounds before we depart later this afternoon to take a ride on the Kent & East Sussex Railway. The dream of rebuilding the old

railway line running from Tenterden in Kent to Robertsbridge in Sussex has taken a major step towards being realised. Enthusiasts who took over the line years after it closed in the 1950's have restored the track and run steam trains from Tenterden as far as Bodiam. The first section of the Rother Valley was opened in 1900 to a station at Tenterden, in fact that station is now known as Rolvenden. The Kent and East Sussex Railway has provided location services for a variety of film and television productions and, over the years, has built up a diverse list of production credits that continues to grow each year.

Day 4. The Faversham Brewery

After a leisurely morning, we depart for Shepherd Neame, where you will discover the secrets of Britain's oldest brewer. There will be a guided tour which also includes a visit to the Old Brewery Store, housed in the old wines and spirits store, which features impressive displays of historic delivery vehicles, a recreated coopers' workshop, bygone pub signs and a

The Cumbria Hotel was built in 1880, set in 20 acres of private gardens, woodland and overlooking Morecambe Bay. The hotel offers a restaurant and a bar/lounge where guests can unwind with a drink. Guests can enjoy a complimentary breakfast. Public areas are equipped with complimentary wireless internet access. There are 124 bedrooms and suites. Grange is a pretty resort with an Edwardian flavour and a mild climate. It is on the shores of Morecambe Bay, and from the 13th century until the 1850's, the major route from Lancaster was across the sands. In 1887, the coming of the Furness Railway encouraged the growth of Grange from a small hamlet to the town we see today. The town developed in the Victorian era from a small fishing village, and the arrival of the railway made it a popular seaside resort on the north side of Morecambe Bay, across the sands from Morecambe. The River Kent used to flow past the town's mile-long promenade but its course migrated south, away from Grange. The sands or mudflats with dangerous quicksands became a grass meadow now grazed by small flocks of sheep. The clock tower in Grange-over-Sands was put up in 1912, in the style of Manchester architect Edgar Wood, with diagonal buttresses, a small band of bell-openings, and a short octagonal spire.

Day 1. Depart Local Area

The Railway was also open to passenger traffic (beginning in 1876) and was built to the narrow gauge of 3ft (between the rails); this made the Ravenglass & Eskdale Railway the first public narrow-gauge railway in England!

After a great day we then will head back to our hotel for dinner.

Day 4. Holker Hall & Gardens

After breakfast we head for Holker Hall, dating back to the early 1600's. Holker Hall has been home to the Preston, Lowther and Cavendish families. The estate has passed by inheritance through the family line and is a wonderful example of the magnificent neo-Elizabethan Gothic style, yet at the same time with all the space and charm of a Victorian stately home. The dramatic formal gardens welcome you with displays of colour and interest. From there, winding paths take you through the collection of rare and exotic plants and trees. Highlights along the way are the Cascade and Burlington Fountain, the Sunken Garden, Pagen Grove, and the 400-year-old veteran lime tree, the Holker Great Lime, voted one of Britain's grandest trees with its girth at over 8 metres. Holker is home to the National Collection of Styracaceae, seen flowering through early summer.

In 1978, Karol Wojtyla, archbishop of Kraków, was elevated to the papacy as Pope John Paul II - the first Slavic pope ever, and the first non-Italian pope in 455 years. Also that year, UNESCO approved the first ever sites for its new World Heritage list, including the entire Old Town in inscribing Krakow's Historic Centre.







Day 1. Depart Local Area

After boarding your luxury coach, we drive to Dover for our morning short ferry crossing to Calais. We will be travelling across Northern Europe, with stops en-route, as we make our way to Dusseldorf in Germany for our first overnight with dinner, bed and breakfast at the Mercure City North Hotel.

Later we will then travel to the Wieliczka Salt Mine. Wieliczka Salt Mine is one of Poland's most popular attractions. It's a subterranean labyrinth of tunnels and chambers distributed over nine levels, the deepest being 327m underground. There are many steps to reach the main Chapel, but you see many interesting things on your way. There is a lift for disabled people which takes you straight down to the bottom & return. The salt-hewn formations include chapels with altarpieces and figures, and there are even underground lakes. The climax of the tour is the vast chamber (54m by 18m, and 12m high) housing the ornamented Chapel of St Kinga. Every single element here, from chandeliers to altarpieces, is made of salt. It took over 30 years (1895). for three men to complete this underground temple., warm clothing is best worn as its all below ground. To come back to the surface, you will ascend in what used to be the miners lift to the surface. We then return to our hotel.

Day 6. Auschwitz-Birkenau

After breakfast and just an hour's drive out of the city, you will find the site of the German P.O.W. camps. You can learn of the harrowing events that took place here during WW2. Stories are sensitively told by the expert guides, who will give you a haunting insight into what life, and death, was like for its millions of

inhabitants. It is a real eye-opening experience. Later we return to the hotel to get ready for dinner.

Day 7. Depart for Dresden

Today we depart Krakow and travel to the beautiful city of Dresden and the NH Collection Dresden Altmarkt where we will spend one night with dinner and breakfast. This 4* hotel is located on the Altmarket Square in Dresden's Old Town. The hotel offers modern rooms which are bright and spacious and classically furnished. All rooms are air-conditioned and feature TV. hairdryer, tea/coffee making facilities, radio and safe. Breakfast is buffet style, with a selection of German dishes served in the elegant restaurant. Few places combine natural beauty and 18th-century elegance quite like Westport. Located along the Wild Atlantic Way in a rugged corner of County Mayo. Holidays to the Dolomites invite you to uncover beautiful secrets in one of the most stunning mountain ranges in the world, an Eden of striking peaks, lush valleys, and hidden lakes. Vertical walls, sheer cliffs and sharp plateaux combine to make an unmistakable silhouette. The Dolomites were named for the rock they are made of. At dusk and dawn, the sunlight paints the mountains pink and purple, a phenomenon called enrosadira by the locals. Wandering through sweeping valleys and past clear lakes, this area is unheard of in Britain, so you can experience natural Italian beauty without the hordes of tourists.







Day 1. Depart For Germany

After an early start and boarding your luxury coach, we make our way to Dover for our morning ferry crossing. At Dover, all passports will be needed for inspection by French Immigration. We travel through France to the Mercure Hotel Saarbrucken, where we will spend our first and last overnight stop with dinner, bed, and breakfast. There is also a welcome drink of juice on arrival.



The forest was the first National Forest Park, designated in 1938. Tourism has slowly developed but has only recently become economically important for the area. Of note are the colonies of Greater and Lesser Horseshoe bats, the largest colonies of these bats in Europe. The forest is also well known for its woodland and heathland birds and invertebrates.





The scheme will also ensure your repatriation in the event the company becomes insolvent. Our trading charter and booking conditions set out clearly and simply the responsibility we have to you and, in turn, you have with us when a contract is made. Please see the Consumer Guarantee at https://www.abtot.com/bch-abtot-membersdirectory/. There is no financial protection if you purchase just transport or accommodation, only from us. We fully comply with the Package Travel and Linked Travel Arrangements Regulations 2018. The combination of travel services offered to you is a package holiday within the meaning of the Regulations. Therefore, you will benefit from all rights applying to package holidays. R B Coach Travel I td will be fully responsible for the proper performance of the holiday and providing assistance if you are in difficulty. Your key rights will be in the details of the tour, which will be provided prior to booking.

2. Booking & Payment

When a booking is made, the 'lead name' on the booking guarantees that he or she is 18 or over and has the authority and accepts on behalf of the party the terms of these booking conditions and pays a deposit indicated in the brochure and as confirmed in the pre-contract information. After we receive your booking and all appropriate payments, if the arrangements you wish to book are available, we will send you a confirmation invoice within 14 days. This confirmation will include any special requests we have agreed. A binding agreement will come into existence between us when we dispatch this invoice to the 'lead name'. Please check the confirmation carefully to ensure all the information is correct. This contract is governed by English Law and the jurisdiction of the English Courts. Single occupancy of rooms, when available, may be subject to a supplementary charge, and these will be shown in the brochure. You can book by paying a deposit for each person named on the booking, but our commitment is always conditional on the balance being paid as below

Deposit: £40 up to 5 days, £50 over 5 days, per person.

4. Our Pricing Policy

When we become aware of any such error, we will endeavour to notify you at the time of booking (if we are then aware of the mistake) or as soon as reasonably possible. However, notification must be received in writing at our offices from the person who signed the booking form, at least 6 weeks before departure. This must be accompanied by a payment of £20 to cover our administrative costs, plus the costs we incur in making the amendment. Alterations cannot be made within 6 weeks of departure, and any such request for an alteration will be treated as a cancellation of the original booking and will be subject to the cancellation charges set out in the paragraph below. Walkers and mobility scooters may be available for hire from your holiday destination.
